

Ladies Hostel

Calicut University Ladies Hostel, established in 1987, located in the campus is almost 750 metres away from the main gate. It has five building blocks named Annexe, Mulla, Parijatham, Devadaru and Everest that accommodate over 2000 students, including PG and research scholars. Individual rooms are provided for researchers, while PG students share the rooms.

Every building of the hostel has a reading area. These reading areas are provided with four different daily newspapers and a television. All the blocks are equipped with high speed Wi-Fi networks. The hostel fees are reasonable, with single rooms costing Rs. 175 and shared rooms costing Rs. 80. The mess is controlled by students and the mess fee is calculated on dividing the total bill between the users and usually the mess bill is limited to a maximum of Rs. 1500 per month.

Student's safety is ensured by gated wall and further security is ensured by a matron in each block and one security guard at the main gate. The gardeners and students keep the ambiance serene and peaceful by maintaining a large number of plants. This altogether contributes to the aesthetic beauty of the ladies hostel.

Men's Hostel

The Calicut University Men's Hostel, that is located on-campus, comprises of five blocks and houses over 480 student inmates. The individual blocks – Old Block, New Block, Annexe, New Annexe and PhD blocks provide rooms to PG, M. Phil and PhD students in separate blocks. Its location within the campus is beneficial to the students as their respective departments are just within walking distance. Also, it has the added advantage by enabling the students to work for desired hours in their laboratories, libraries and getting involved in extra-curricular activities etc.

The hostel amenities include reading rooms in every block that are provided with daily newspapers, television, high-speed WiFi internet and board games. The other basic features include round the clock electricity, water purifiers, bike and car parking spaces, two badminton courts, a volleyball court and beautiful gardens. All blocks are with common bathrooms that are in numbers proportional to the hosteller's strength and are maintained weekly. The inmates are provided with mess food that are run by the students themselves.

Admission can be sought upon recommendation by the concerned Head of the Department and further registration at the Hostel office. New in-mates are required to pay an advance rent of six months at the time of admission. The expenses for each student is comparatively minimal. The room rent limits under Rs. 200, and varies according to single or sharing rooms, the latter of which is cheaper. While the mess bill amounts to a maximum of only Rs. 1500, as it is co-ordinated by the students. The office staff, warden, cooks, gardener and sweepers support the inmates in every need.

The hostel is a truly pleasant place to live due to the good environment maintained by all those concerned with it. Everyone is treated with respect and allowed to be themselves, while taking care to not harm or disturb others by any means.
